The department of commerce was later abolished and the faculty of management studies of the University of Delhi was established. After the reconstitution of the Delhi College of Engineering by the Government of NCT of Delhi in 2009, by Act 6 of 2009, passed by the assembly of the NCT of Delhi, DCE became Delhi Technological University. 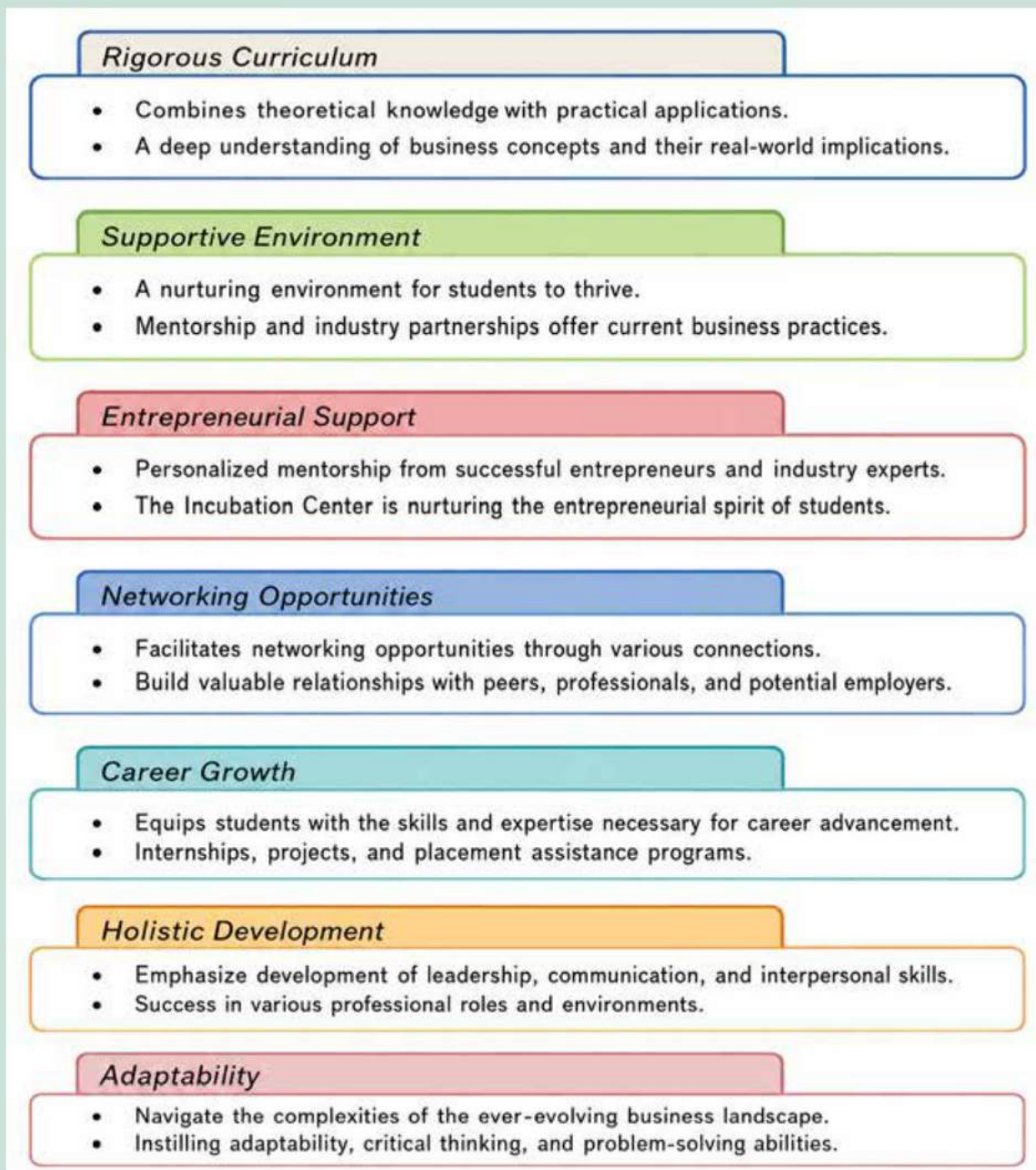


2. About MBA - Innovation, Entrepreneurship, and Venture Development (IEV)

The MBA-IEV programme, offered at Delhi School of Management, DTU, is designed to equip students with the skills, knowledge, and experience needed to excel in the realms of innovation, entrepreneurship, and venture creation. Emphasizing entrepreneurship, this programme ensures the delivery of a comprehensive portfolio of professionally designed courses in entrepreneurship and venture development. Aspiring to be a world class practice-based school, Delhi School of Management seeks to offer practicum mode learning programs in entrepreneurship, which are experiential and outcome based in nature.

Background: The AICTE in its start-up policy in 2016 announced the need and overall design for an experiential learning cum outcome-based MBA program in entrepreneurship. It was to be focused on outcome-based evaluation, with a curriculum divided over components such as knowledge, attitude and behavioural element and skills. Based on this background, the syllabus of two years MBA in Innovation, Entrepreneurship and Venture Development comprises module-based learning of core and elective courses, out of classroom activities and workshop-based skill certification, experiential learning modules, entrepreneurship idea development-based Capstone Projects and Action Learning segments focused on implementation of start-up ideas. With the objective of connecting theory of innovation and entrepreneurship with practice and enabling students to acquire skills, this outcome-oriented program is designed for delivery in four phases with up to two modules each. The program is focused on learning grounded in all stages of the new venture development process. It will require that students create their own venture in their chosen area within the first semester, and go through the stages of entrepreneurial activity, while learning about these through knowledge and experiential courses. They will simultaneously apply their entrepreneurial skills in real life situations, validate ideas, test markets and build a successful venture. These outcomes will be achieved with guidance from mentors/faculty, experiential learning, workshops on hands-on aspects of forming and running a company, start-up finance, awareness of Government funding schemes. There will be evaluation of outcomes achieved by students in their proposed business and venture development plans, actual venture formation and proof of concept tests, etc.

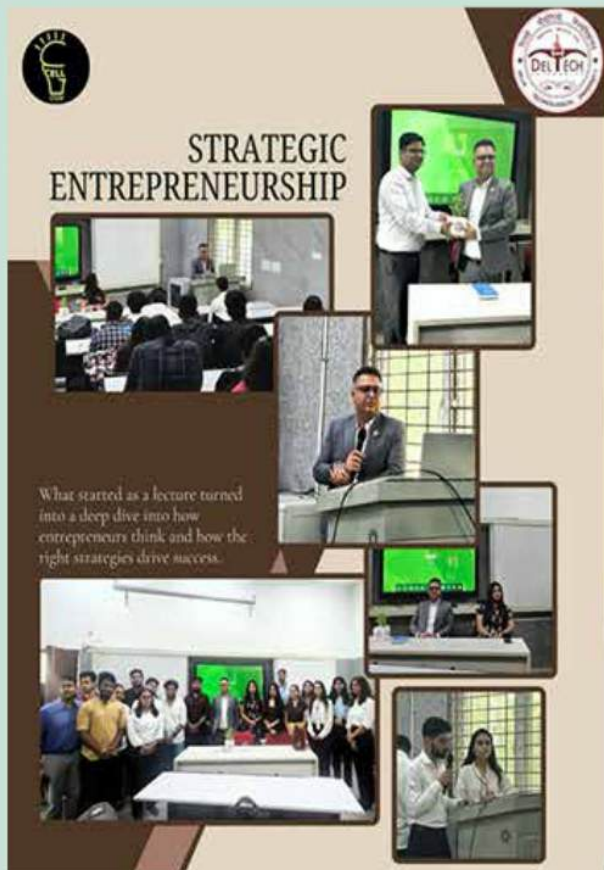
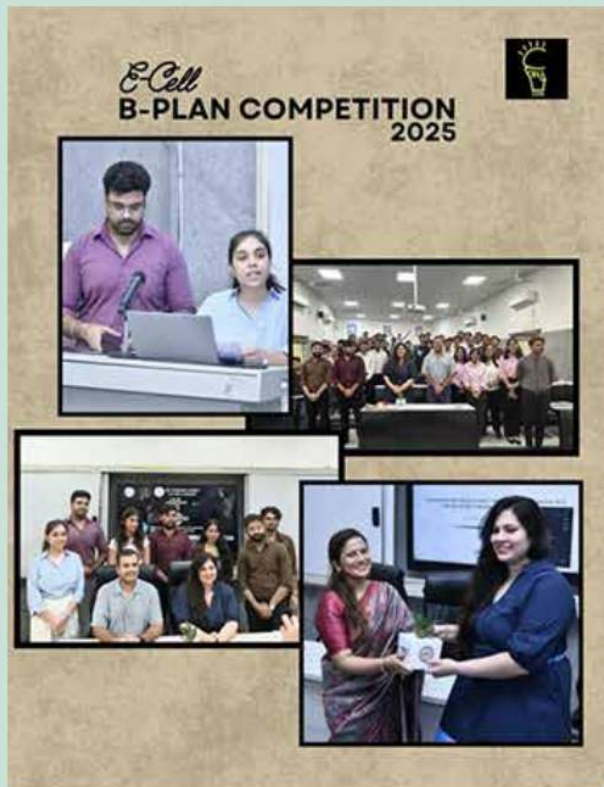

Admission Process

1. MBA

Delhi School of Management, DTU follows an online process of application for the MBA program. Centralized Counselling for admission to MBA program for pioneering universities of Govt. of NCT of Delhi, namely Delhi Technological University (DTU), Netaji Subhas University of Technology (NSUT) and Indira Gandhi Delhi Technical University for Women (IGDTUW) will be conducted through Common Management Admission Committee CMAC (PG), 2026.

Prospective candidates are required to fill a single online application form on the website <http://www.dtu.ac.in/> www.cmacadmissions.com to participate in the centralized admission under CMAC (PG)-2026.

Intake

DSM offers a total of 270 seats. The reservations of the seats for SC/ST/OBC/EWS and sub-categories Defence/ PD are as per the norms. One seat over and above the total intake is reserved for Kashmiri migrants. However, there will be no relaxation in the minimum eligibility criteria for Kashmiri Migrants.

Eligibility Criteria

Minimum Eligibility for MBA Admissions: FOR DTU and NSUT:

- a) A candidate who has passed any Bachelor Degree examination with minimum 60% marks in aggregate or equivalent CGPA from a recognized university/institution and valid CAT-2025/MAT-2025 /MAT-2026 score. However, a relaxation of 10% in marks to SC/ST/PD candidates shall be given in minimum eligibility criteria.

Minimum Eligibility for MBA Admissions: FOR IGDTUW

- a) A female candidate who has passed any Bachelor Degree examination with minimum 60% marks in aggregate or equivalent CGPA from a recognized university/institution and valid CAT-2025 /MAT-2025 /MAT-2026 score. However, a relaxation of 10% in marks to SC/ST/PD candidates and 5% to Other Backward Class (OBC-NCL) / Defense Category (CW) shall be given in minimum eligibility criteria.
- b) The student should hold a degree from any of the universities incorporated by an act of the central or state legislature in India, or other educational institutions established by an Act of Parliament or declared to be deemed as a university under section 3 of UGC Act, 1956, or possess an equivalent qualification recognized by the Ministry of Education, Government of India.
- c) Those who are appearing in final semester examination may also apply, provided that they submit

- The proof of eligibility by a specific date declared by the University,
and
- Valid CAT-2025 /MAT-2025 /MAT-2026 score at the time of application, otherwise the admission of the candidate to the university will be cancelled.

NOTE: Candidates appearing in the final semester/year must secure a minimum of aggregate marks, as per eligibility criteria, upon the declaration of results; otherwise, their admission will stand cancelled.

- d) In case the conversion formula for CGPA is not provided by the concerned Institute/ University, equivalent percentage shall be computed as per the formula: $CGPA \times 10 =$ Percentage of Marks

NOTE: At any stage of the program, if it is found that the candidate does not fulfill the eligibility criteria, his/ her admission shall be cancelled, and fee shall not be refunded.

Selection Criteria

- The applications received will be shortlisted based on performance in CAT-2025/ MAT-2025/MAT-2026.
- The shortlisted candidates will be required to appear for a Personal Interview and document verification. The candidates who do not participate in Personal Interview/ Document Verification will not be considered in final Merit List.
- The merit list will first consider the candidates with valid CAT-2025 percentile and after the CAT-2025 candidates are exhausted, the candidates with valid MAT-2025/ 2026 percentile will be considered in the merit list. In case any candidate has appeared in both MAT-2025 and MAT-2026, Best of Two will be taken in consideration. The CAT-2025 or MAT-2025/ 2026 percentile will be rounded upto two decimal places for calculating the Weightage.
- The Merit list will be prepared considering the following components:
 - CAT-2025 Percentile (Priority 1) or MAT-2025/2026 Percentile (Priority 2)
 - Personal Interview
- The Weightage of different components for preparing Merit List is given as under:

Priority 1

***The cut off for CAT-2025 and MAT- 2025/2026 will be decided by the CMAC committee. At present only CAT-2025 and MAT- 2025/2026 percentile will be considered for Merit preparation.**

- f) The allotment of universities will be based on the candidate's rank in the merit list, subject to eligibility, seat availability in the respective category, and the candidate's stated preference of the university at the time of application.
- g) In case of tie in the final merit list, the following criteria shall be used:
 - i) The candidate with higher entrance test percentile (CAT-2025 and MAT- 2025/2026 as applicable), shall be ranked higher.
 - ii) In case of tie in CAT/MAT percentile, the candidate shall be ranked according to the date of birth i.e., the person older in age will be ranked higher.
 - iii) In case of tie in the age criterion, random number will be used to break the tie.

ADMISSION COUNSELLING PROCEDURE

1 Registration Process

All candidates desirous of seeking admission to the MBA programs at DTU, IGDTUW and NSUT are required to visit website www.dtu.ac.in/www.cmacadmissions.com and fill registration form, pay a non-refundable registration fee and fill the choices for allotment of seat. The details of registration fee are given below:

Documents to be uploaded at the time of registration

Following is the list of documents required for uploading at the time of filling up of online application form:

- a) Degree and mark sheets of the qualifying examination or undertaking along with mark sheets till the previous semester
- b) Certificates and Marks sheet of the 10th and 12th examination.
- c) Scanned copy of CAT-2025/MAT-2025/ MAT-2026. Students must possess CAT/MAT Login ID and Password for online verification.
- d) Date of Birth Certificate as indicated in High School or equivalent examination.
- e) Reserved category/sub-category certificates, if applicable.
- f) Experience certificate(s)
- g) Recent passport size photograph
- h) Undertaking (if Required)

NOTE: ONLINE REGISTRATION IS ALLOWED AS PER COUNSELLING SCHEDULE ONLY.

NOTE: The OBC-NCL or EWS candidates can submit old certificate and undertaking at present in the application form. However, the candidates must submit the OBC-NCL or EWS Certificate issued on or after 31.03.2026 at the time of the Personal Interview and Document Verification.

B) Personal Interview and Document Verification

The shortlisted candidates will be called for Personal Interview and Document verification in physical mode. The venue and date for the same will be announced on www.cmacadmission.com. The merit list of the eligible candidates will be announced on CMAC (PG)-2026 website before First round of Counselling.

NOTE: The candidates, who do not attend the Personal Interview and document verification process, will not be considered in the merit list.

C) Counselling and Payment of Seat Acceptance Fee:

The seat allotment will be in online mode based on candidates' rank in the merit list within their respective category, subject to eligibility and availability of seats in that category. A candidate who is allotted a seat in any round of counselling is required to pay the part admission fee of Rs. 1,00,000/- (Rs. One Lakh only) as per the payment mode instructed in the guidelines of counselling.

All the candidates who get an allotment will have to pay part admission fee (Rs. 1,00,000 – Rupees One Lakh) as per the admission schedule, failing which his/her allotted seat will automatically stand cancelled and the candidate will not be considered for subsequent rounds of seat allotment. However, such candidates are eligible for spot round of counselling. Balance fees need to be paid by the candidate in the respective University at the time of academic registration.

NOTE: If the candidate is allotted a seat in a round and he/she does not pay the required academic fee as per counselling schedule, his/her allotted seat shall be cancelled and he/she will not be considered for any seat allotment in subsequent rounds (except spot round).

D) Upgradation

Before the beginning of subsequent round of counselling, candidates will be automatically upgraded based on the preferences provided during registration. The upgradation will be subject to the candidate's preference, rank in the merit list, eligibility for the respective university, and availability of seats in the respective category.

E) Spot round

Spot round may be conducted if seats remain vacant. Details of spot round will be notified on the website www.cmacadmissions.com.

NOTE:

* Fresh applications against vacant seats, if any, may be invited by following an alternative admission criterion in spot round of admissions by CMAC (PG) 2026.

**Special spot round may be conducted by the respective University separately after the spot round depending upon the availability of vacant seats.

F) Reporting at final allotted university

All provisionally admitted candidates are required to visit the website of allotted university for physical verification of original documents/commencement of classes and payment of balance fee (if any). Admitted candidates need to pay the balance fee at the final allotted University AS PER FEE PAYMENT SCHEDULE available on respective university website, failing which, the admission of the candidate automatically stands cancelled ipso facto.

2. MBA(IEV)

Intake

The annual intake of this program is 30. The reservations of the seats for SC/ST/OBC/EWS and sub categories Defence/ PWD are as per the DTU norms.

Eligibility Criteria

A candidate who has passed a graduate degree program and has scored minimum 50% marks in aggregate or equivalent CGPA from a recognized university/institution are eligible to apply.

- a. Relaxation of 10% in marks to SC/ST/PWD candidates shall be given in eligibility criteria.
- b. Those who are appearing in the final semester examination may also apply, provided that they submit the proof of eligibility and graduation marks at the time of personal interview.
- c. - a) A candidate who has passed any bachelor's degree examination with atleast one paper in mathematics/statistics/applied mathematics with a minimum 60% marks in aggregate or equivalent CGPA from a recognized university/institution is eligible to apply. However, a relaxation of 10% in marks shall be given in eligibility criteria to SC/ST/PWD candidates.

 - Priority II** – Wards of disabled in action and boarded out from service.
 - Priority III** - Widows/wards of Defence Personnel who died in peace time with death attributable to military service.

 - ii. Defence personnel disabled in service and boarded with disability attributable to military service

 - Priority VIII** – Wards of serving personnel.
 - Priority IX** - Wives of serving personnel.
- f. **Differently Abled Persons (PD):** 5% of the total seats (Horizontally) in each category are reserved for candidates belonging to 'Person with Disability' sub-category.
- g. **Kashmiri Migrants (KM) (Supernumerary):** 01 (One) seat over and above the total intake is available under this category.

- b) Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- c) Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidates and/or his/her family normally resides
- d) Administrator/Secretary to Administration/Development Officer (Laccadive & Minicoy Islands).

NOTE:

- a) The candidate seeking admission under reserved categories has to mandatorily upload the caste/ category certificate in his/her name at the time of filling up of the ONLINE form. The certificate in the name of either of the parents (mother/father) or any other family member is not acceptable and the candidate will not be entitled even for provisional admission.
- b) OBC (NCL) candidates are required to produce a caste certificate issued after March 31, 2026 from the authorities as mentioned above. C) Kashmiri Migrants

The candidates seeking admission under Kashmiri Migrants seats must upload the following documents at the time of filling up of the online application:

- a) Certificate of registration as Kashmiri Migrants issued by the Relief Commissioner, Jammu or Divisional Commissioner, Delhi to establish the status of the applicant as registered migrants.
- b) Degree and Mark-sheet of the qualifying examination.
- c) Secondary School Examination or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto (showing the Date of Birth).
- d) Proof of property in Kashmir of the parent of the candidate.
- e) Proof of current residence such as Ration Card, Photo Identity Card issued by the Election Commissioner, Driving License, etc.

D) Economically Weaker Section

Criteria for Income and Assets The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed by persons who are not covered under the scheme of reservation for SCs, STs and OBCs upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority based upon the following criteria:

Candidates whose family has gross annual income below Rs 8.0 lakh (Rupees eight lakh only) are to be identified as EWSs for benefit of reservation. Income shall also include income from all sources i.e. salary, agriculture, business, profession, etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application. "31st March 2026"

Also persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS, irrespective of the family income:-

- i. 5 acres of agricultural land and above;
- ii. Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above;
- iii. Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities;
- iv. Residential, plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities.

The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status. The term "Family" for this purpose will include the person who seeks benefit of reservation, his/her parents and siblings below the age of 18 years as also his/her spouse and children below the age of 18 years. The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority after March 31, 2026. The Income and Asset Certificate issued 'by any one of the following authorities in the prescribed format as given in Annexure-3 shall only be accepted as proof of candidate's claim as 'belonging to EWS. A list of approved authorities is given below:

- a) District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/ Collector/ Deputy Commissioner/ Additional Deputy Commissioner/ 1st Class Stipendary Magistrate/ Sub Divisional Magistrate/ Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner
- b) Chief Presidency Magistrate/Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Presidency Magistrate
- c) Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar and
- d) Sub-Divisional Officer or the area where the candidate and/or his family normally resides.

E) Defence sub-category (CW)

For admission to a seat reserved for Defence sub-category, candidate must produce the following certificates (as applicable), in original, at the time of document verification of Defence candidates.

- a) Entitlement card in original issued by the Record Officer of the Unit/Regiment of Armed Personnel of the Armed Forces in case of Armed Personnel.
- b) Widows/ Wards/ Wives of the officers and men of Armed forces who died or were disabled on duty (both attributable to military service) must produce a certificate to that effect from the following authorities: (i) Secretary, Kendriya Sainik Board. (ii) Secretary, Rajya / Zila Sainik Board. (iii) Officer-in-Charge, Record Office.
- c) Medical records in original.
- d) Special Pension Order and Passbook indicating special pension.
- e) Gallantry Award Certificate.

- f) Original ex-servicemen Identity Card/ Discharge Book/ Pension Payment Order.
- g) Dependency card issued by the competent authority in order to relate the relationship of the candidate with the Defence personnel.
- h) Original Service Identity Card.
- i) A certificate from the respective C.O. Unit in respect of serving personnel.

NOTE: A statement to the effect that 'the death/disability is attributed to military service' is required to be included in the certificate for Priority III & IV.
