The department of commerce was later abolished and the faculty of management studies of the University of Delhi was established. Delhi College of Engineering is thus the mother institution of a number of national projects including IITD, SPA, College of Arts and even the famous FMS.



After the reconstitution of the Delhi College of Engineering by the Government of NCT of Delhi in 2009, by Act 6 of 2009, passed by the assembly of the NCT of Delhi, DCE became Delhi Technological University. #### 1. Vinod Dham Centre of Excellence for Semiconductors and Microelectronics

The Vinod Dham Centre of Excellence for Semiconductors and Microelectronics (VDCoE4SM) at Delhi Technological University (DTU) centre is dedicated to advancing training and research in semiconductor technology and integrated circuit (IC) manufacturing. It aims to boost productivity, address emerging skill gaps, and align academic pursuits with industry needs, thereby supporting India's Semiconductor Mission and fostering a robust research and development ecosystem. In December 2024, VDCoE4SM organized a Faculty Development Program titled "Recent Trends in Semiconductor Technology and Chip Design." State-of-the-art facility for training & testing will be created to carry out interdisciplinary research in Electric Vehicles and associated areas. This Centre is jointly funded by Delhi Knowledge Development Foundation (DKDF), Govt. of NCT of Delhi and Delhi Technological University, Delhi. CoE for EVRT focused research areas will include, but not be limited to design, development, and analysis of electric vehicle motors and drives, charging station infrastructure, charge controllers, communication infrastructure for information dissemination between the power grid and EVs, battery management systems, retrofitting, etc. This Centre is not only providing interdisciplinary research and development ecosystems but also offering internships, skills development courses, entrepreneurship programs and facilitating industrial trainings for undergraduate/ postgraduate students and research scholars. In addition, the Centre will also offer regular PG/certificate courses in the near future. The facility will strive for networking and collaboration with industries, research laboratories, and other institutions of excellence in India and abroad to carry out cutting-edge research and development in EVs, along with offering postgraduate programmes.

#### 4. Centre of Excellence in Disaster Risk Reduction

In view of the possibilities of catastrophic consequences in India arising due to various natural disasters, viz. environmental and climate change related hazards, earthquake, landslide, flood, cyclone, GLOF, fire etc., that may affect several neighbouring countries together at a time, it becomes imperative that these countries pool together their resources and expertise, especially in the field of science and technology. Taking the lead in disaster risk reduction, Department of Civil Engineering, Delhi Technological University (DTU) is proposing to establish a Centre of Excellence in Disaster Risk Reduction (COEDRR). The COEDRR would endeavor to develop itself as a nodal Centre in Disaster Risk Reduction in the country by creating expertise to innovate new technologies to reduce the impacts of natural and man-made disasters though multi-disciplinary technological and scientific approach. Besides, the Centre of Excellence (CoE) also proposes to run Foundation Elective Courses (FEC) viz. Climate Change and Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR), Earthquake Safety, Fire Safety etc., M. Tech. program in Disaster Mitigation and Management (DMM) and joint PhD programme in DMM and allied areas in collaboration with leading national and international institutes and organizing.

### **5.Centre of Excellence for The Science of Happiness**

The primary mission of DTU's Centre is to promote research, training, and education focused on well-being for both students and faculty. By applying the science of happiness, the Centre aims to enhance the quality of life by fostering positive emotions and nurturing strong relationships. In future, the Centre aims to work in close coordination with Central / State Government Agencies and Industries in fulfilment of Government objectives, capacity building, research and consultancy.




#### **About Master of Business Administration (MBA) Program**



## COURSE CURRICULUM OF MBA

MBA Program is a two-year full time professional program spread over four semesters, which combines rigorous academic schedules with proactive efforts to develop new perspectives and a higher level of knowledge and understanding.

The Program focuses on inculcating effective managerial and leadership skills. The first year of the program offers core courses to develop the right attitude, knowledge and skills which are essential for a leader in the long term. The elective courses offered in the second year give students an opportunity to delve deeper in their respective areas of specialization and thus cater to the role and sector specific career objectives.

### **Types of Specialization**

The syllabus has been designed to provide more flexibility and freedom to the students to choose a combination of specialization and electives from the basket.

A student can opt for:

Note: In addition to major/minor/dual specialization, students may also make their own basket of courses across functional areas. In such cases, MBA degree without any specialization shall be awarded.

### No. of papers to be opted under the above combinations:

- 1. Major (3 each in III & IV Sem)
- 2. Minor (1 each in III & IV Sem)
- 3. Dual (2 each in III & IV semester)

However, as per the policy, a particular elective paper shall be offered only as per University norms. The department may also restrict some of the combinations of specialization/electives keeping in view the industry trend, job opportunities and students' preferences.

# **ADMISSION PROCESS, CMAC-2025**

Delhi School of Management, DTU follows an online process of application for the MBA program. Centralized Counselling for admission to MBA program for pioneering universities of Govt. of NCT of Delhi, namely Delhi Technological University (DTU), Netaji Subhas University of Technology (NSUT) and Indira Gandhi Delhi Technical University for Women (IGDTUW) will be conducted through Common Management Admission Committee CMAC, 2025.

Prospective candidates are required to fill a single online application form on the website http://www.dtu. ac.in/www.cmacadmissions.com to participate in the centralized admission under CMAC-2025.

#### **INTAKE**

DSM offers a total of 270 seats. The reservations of the seats for SC/ST/OBC/EWS and sub categories Defence/ PWD are as per the norms. One seat over and above the total intake is reserved for Kashmiri migrants. However, there will be no relaxation in the minimum eligibility criteria for Kashmiri Migrants.

# RESERVATION POLICY

- a) Scheduled Caste (SC): 15 % of the total seats are reserved for Scheduled Caste candidates.
- **b) Scheduled Tribe (ST):** 7.5 % of the total seats are reserved for Scheduled Tribe candidates.
- **c)** Other Backward Class (OBC- NCL): 27% of the total seats are reserved for Other Backward Class (Non-Creamy Layer) candidates.
- **d) Economically Weaker Section (EWS)**: 10% of the total seats are reserved for EWS category as per the office order DHE.1 (119)/Estt./2018- 19/2549-76 dated 17/06/2019

Sub-categories namely 'Defence' and 'Person with Disability' are available under each category (General, SC, ST, OBC-NCL).

- **e) Defence (CW)**: 5% of the total seats (Horizontal) in each main category are reserved for candidates belonging to Defence sub-category in the following order of priority:
  - **Priority I** Widows/wards of Defence Personnel killed in action.
  - **Priority II** Wards of disabled in action and boarded out from service.
  - **Priority III** Widows/wards of Defence Personnel who died while in service with death attributable to military service.
  - **Priority IV** Wards of disabled in service and boarded out from service with disability attributable to military service.
  - **Priority V** Wards of Ex-Servicemen and serving personnel/para military/ police personnel who are in receipt of the following Gallantry Awards: 1. Param Vir Chakra 2. Ashok Chakra 3. Mahavir Chakra 4.

Kirti Chakra 5. Vir Chakra 6. Shaurya Chakra 7. Sena/Nau Sena/ Vayu Sena Medal 8. Mention-in-Despatches 9. President's Police Medal for Gallantry 10. Police Medal for Gallantry

**Priority VI** – Wards of Ex-servicemen.

Priority VII - Wives of:

- 1.Defence personnel disabled in action and boarded out from service
- 2.Defence personnel disabled in service and boarded out with disability attributable to military service
- 3.Ex-servicemen and serving personnel who are in receipt of Gallantry awards.

**Priority VIII** – Wards of serving personnel.

**Priority IX** - Wives of serving personnel.

- **f) Person with Disability:** 5% of the total seats (Horizontally) in each category are reserved for candidates belonging to 'Person with Disability' sub-category in accordance with the provisions of 'The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016' (PwD Act)
- **g) Kashmiri Migrants (Supernumerary):** 01 (One) seat, over and above the total intake is available under this category.

Note:

- i. In case of category (a) and (b), the vacant seats are interchangeable.
- ii. In case, sufficient numbers of eligible candidates from category (c) are not available, the vacancies will be treated as unreserved.
- iii. Seats under sub-category (f) are interchangeable within the sub category if sufficient number of candidates is not available in a particular group.
- iv. In case, sufficient number of eligible candidates from the sub categories mentioned at (e) and (f) are not available, the vacancies will be treated as unreserved in the respective category.
- v. Under CW sub-category, the seats will be filled based on the priority, i.e. all eligible candidates of priority-I will be allotted seats based on their ranks until the ranks exhaust or seats exhaust under CW sub category. Remaining vacant seats, if any, will be allotted to the priority-II in the similar way, and so on.
- vi. The reservation under CW sub category is available only to such candidates who fall under the listed priorities.
- vii. It is the sole responsibility of the candidate to prove his/her eligibility for claiming reservation under any of the reserved categories/sub categories. The candidates claiming reservation under SC/ST/OBC/EWS/KM categories, CW/PwD sub-categories will be required to upload scanned copy of the respective certificates and produce the original certificate of the respective reserved category/sub-category issued by the competent authority (as mentioned in this information brochure) in the respective institutes at the time of physical verification of the documents. If the reserved category/ sub-category certificate is not found in order, no benefit of the reserved category/ sub-category will be given and the candidate shall be considered for allotment in GENERAL category in subsequent rounds on submission of written request by the candidate to CMAC in person or email in this regard, as per the eligibility of the candidate and availability of seats. If such candidate is able to produce his/her category certificate before the commencement of further round, he/she shall be considered for the category in that round and will be allotted a fresh seat as per the vacancy available and his/her merit.

viii. After exhausting the complete list of candidates (category-wise) as per prescribed norms, any unfilled seats pertaining to any category may be filled by increasing general category seats, in equal number, during the SPOT round of counselling.

# **ELIGIBILITY AND ADMISSION PROCEDURE**

# 1. Minimum Eligibility Criteria

- a)A candidate who has passed any Bachelor Degree examination with minimum 60% marks in aggregate or equivalent CGPA from a recognised university/institution and valid CAT- 2024/MAT-2024 /MAT-2025 score. However, a relaxation of 10% in marks to SC/ST/PWD candidates shall be given in minimum eligibility criteria.
- b)The student should hold a degree from any of the universities incorporated by an act of the central or state legislature in India, or other educational institutions established by an Act of Parliament or declared to be

deemed as a university under section 3 of UGC Act, 1956, or possess an equivalent qualification recognized by the Ministry of Education, Government of India.

- c) Those who are appearing in final semester examination may also apply, provided that they submit:
- (i) The proof of eligibility by a specific date declared by the University, and
- (ii) Valid CAT/MAT score at the time of application, otherwise the admission of the candidate to the university will be cancelled.

Candidates appearing in final semester/year must secure a minimum of 60% aggregate marks upon declaration of results; otherwise, their admission will stand cancelled.

In case the conversion formula for CGPA is not provided by the concerned Institute/ University, equivalent percentage shall be computed as per following formula:

#### CGPA × 10 = Percentage of Marks

Note: At any stage of the program, if it is found that the candidate does not fulfil the eligibility criteria, his/ her admission shall be cancelled and fee shall not be refunded.

#### 2. Selection Procedure

- a) The applications received will be shortlisted based on performance in CAT- 2024/MAT-2024/MAT-2025.
- b) The shortlisted candidates will be required to appear for a Personal Interview.
- c)The merit list will first consider the candidates with valid CAT 2024 **percentile** and after the CAT 2024 candidates are exhausted, the candidates with MAT 2024/ 2025 **percentiles** will be considered in the merit list. In case any candidate has appeared in both MAT 2024 and MAT 2025, best of two will be taken into consideration.

CAT percentile (rounded upto two decimal places) of 2024 will be considered whereas the best percentile of MAT 2024/MAT 2025 will be considered.

- d)The allotment of universities will be based on the candidate's rank in the merit list (within their respective category), subject to eligibility, seat availability in the respective category, and the candidate's stated preference of university at the time of application.
- e)In case of tie in the final merit list, the following criteria shall be used:
- (i) The candidate with higher entrance test percentile shall be ranked higher (CAT/MAT as applicable).
- (ii) In case of tie in CAT/MAT percentile, the candidate shall be ranked according to the date of birth i.e., the person older in age will be ranked higher.
- (iii) In case of tie in age criterion, random number will be used to break the tie.

# ADMISSION COUNSELLING PROCEDURE

## **1 Registration Process**

All candidates desirous of seeking admission to the MBA programs at DTU, IGDTUW and NSUT are required to visit website www.dtu.ac.in/www.cmacadmissions.com and fill registration form, pay a non-refundable registration fee and fill the choices for allotment of seat. The details of registration fee are given below:

# Documents to be uploaded at the time of registration

Following is the list of documents required for uploading at the time of filling up of online application form:

- a)Degree and mark sheets of the qualifying examination or undertaking along with mark sheets till the previous semester
- b)Certificates and Marks sheet of the 10th and 12th examination.
- c)Scanned copy of CAT-2024/MAT-2024/ MAT-2025. Student must possess CAT/MAT Login ID and Password for online verification.
- d)Date of Birth Certificate as indicated in High School or equivalent examination.
- e)Reserved category/sub-category certificates, if applicable.
- f)Experience certificate(s)
- g)Recent passport size photograph
- h)Undertaking (if Required)

Note: The OBC-NCL candidates can submit old certificates and undertakings at present in the application form. However, the candidates must submit the OBC-NCL or EWS certificates issued after March 2025 at the time of Personal Interview and Document Verification.

#### **2 Admission Process**

a)The shortlisted candidates will be called for Personal Interview and document verification in physical mode. The venue and date for the same will be announced on www.dtu.ac.in/www.cmacadmissions.com. The merit list of the eligible candidates will be announced on CMAC website before the first round of counselling.

b)Admission shall be made on the basis of a combined merit list prepared on the basis of CAT- 2024/ MAT-2024/ MAT-2025 percentile, marks in class 10th, class 12th, performance in Personal Interview, and work experience.

c)The candidates will be allotted seats (online) based on their rank in the merit list within their respective category, subject to eligibility and availability of seats in that category.

### 2.1 Payment of seat acceptance fee

A candidate, who is allotted a seat in any round of counselling, is required to pay the part admission fee of Rs. 1,00,000/- (Rs. One Lakh only) as per the payment mode instructed in the guidelines of counselling.

All the candidates who get an allotment will have to pay part admission fee (Rs.1,00,000 – Rupees One Lakh only) as per the admission schedule, failing which his/her allotted seat will stand automatically cancelled and the candidate will not be considered for subsequent rounds of seat allotment. However, such candidates are eligible for a spot round of counselling. Balance fees need to be paid by the candidate in the respective University at the time of academic registration.

Note: If the candidate is allotted a seat in a round and he/she does not pay the required academic fee as per counselling schedule, his/her allotted seat shall be cancelled and he/she will not be considered for any seat allotment in subsequent rounds (except spot round).

# 2.2 Upgradation

After each round of counselling, candidates will be automatically upgraded based on the preferences provided during registration. The upgradation will be subject to the candidate's preference, rank in the merit list, eligibility for the respective university, and availability of seats in the respective category.

Note: The candidates are advised to fill in their preferences carefully. No change will be allowed at a later stage.

# 3.Spot round

Details of spot round will be notified on the university website www.dtu.ac.in/www.cmacadmissions.com

Note-Fresh applications against vacant seats, if any, may be invited and may follow an alternate admission criterion in spot round of admissions by CMAC.

- \* Any change in the counselling schedule due to unforeseen circumstances shall be announced on the university/CMAC website. Candidates are advised to visit the website regularly.
- \*\* Special spot round may be conducted by the university after the spot round depending upon the availability of vacant seats.

# 4. Reporting at final allotted university

All provisionally admitted candidates are required to visit the website of allotted university for physical verification of original documents/commencement of classes and payment of balance fee (if any). Admitted candidates need to pay the balance fee at the final allotted University AS PER FEE PAYMENT SCHEDULE available on respective university website, failing which, the admission of the candidate automatically stands cancelled ipso facto.

# **Certificates required for claiming Reserved Seats**

Candidates applying for any reserved seat (i.e. EWS, SC, ST, OBC-NCL, CW, PD,KM) must upload the scanned copy of the certificates (as applicable) as mentioned below at the time filling up of the ONLINE application form.

#### i.Scheduled Caste (SC)/Scheduled Tribe (ST)/Other Backward Class (OBC-NCL):

For admission to a seat reserved for Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe/ Other Backward Class (NCL), candidate must produce a certificate, in original, issued from an approved district authority stating the

Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe/Other Backward Class (NCL), to which the candidate belongs. A list of approved authorities is given below:

a.District Magistrate / Additional Magistrate / Deputy Commissioner/ Collector / Additional Deputy Commissioner/Deputy Collector/ 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate / City Magistrate (not below the rank of 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate), Sub-Divisional Magistrate / Taluka

Magistrate / Executive Magistrate / Extra Assistant Commissioner.

- b.Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- c.Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidates and/or his/her family normally resides
- d.Administrator/Secretary to Administration/Development Officer (Laccadive & Minicoy Islands).

#### NOTE:

- 1. The candidate seeking admission under reserved categories has to mandatorily upload the caste/ category certificate in his/her name at the time of filling up of the ONLINE form. The certificate in the name of either of the parents (mother/father) or any other family member is not acceptable and the candidate will not be entitled even for provisional admission.
- 2.OBC (NCL) candidates are required to produce a caste certificate issued after March 31, 2025 from the authorities as mentioned above. However, if the certificate is issued prior to March 31, 2025, it must be accompanied with an additional certificate regarding the present non-creamy layer status of the candidate, issued by the same competent authority. This additional certificate must have reference of his/her already issued original caste certificate. At the time of PI and verification of documents, the candidate must provide an updated certificate issued after 31st March 2025.

#### ii.Person with Disability sub-category:

For admission to seat reserved for person with disabilities (PwD) sub-category, the candidate must upload of filling up the Online form:

- a.Certificate of physical disability issued by the Competent Authority as per the provisions of the Persons with Disabilities Act 2016 in the prescribed format as given under the Act.
- b.The candidate with benchmark disabilities shall produce the medical certificate issued by the Govt. Hospitals duly notified by the Govt. of NCT of Delhi/ other State government and further duly verified by the Chief Medical Officer of the concerned Government Hospital.
- c.A certificate duly recommended by Vocational Rehabilitation Centre for the handicapped, 9-11 Vikas Marg, Karkardooma. Delhi 110092.
- **iii.Kashmiri Migrants:** The candidates seeking admission under Kashmiri Migrants seats must upload the following documents at the time of filling up of the online application:
- a.Certificate of registration as Kashmiri Migrants issued by the Relief Commissioner, Jammu or Divisional Commissioner, Delhi to establish the status of the applicant as registered migrants.
- b.Degree and Mark-sheet of the qualifying examination.
- c.Secondary School Examination or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto (showing the Date of Birth).
- d. Proof of property in Kashmir of the parent of the candidate.
- e.Proof of current residence such as Ration Card, Photo Identity Card issued by the Election Commissioner, Driving License, etc.

#### **IV Economically Weaker Section**

Criteria for Income and Assets The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed by persons who are not covered under the scheme of reservation for SCs, STs and OBCs upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority based upon the following criteria:

Candidates whose family has gross annual income below Rs 8.0 lakh (Rupees eight lakh only) are to be identified as EWSs for benefit of reservation. Income shall also include income from all sources i.e. salary, agriculture, business, profession, etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application. "31st March 2025"

Also persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS, irrespective of the family income:- i. 5 acres of agricultural land and above; ii. Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above; iii. Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities; iv. Residential, plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities. The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status. The term "Family" for this purpose will include the person who seeks benefit of reservation, his/her parents and siblings below the age of 18 years as also his/her spouse and children below the age of 18 years. The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority after March 31, 2025. The Income and Asset Certificate issued 'by any one of the following authorities in the prescribed format as given in Annexure-3 shall only be accepted as proof of candidate's claim as 'belonging to EWS. A list of approved authorities is given below:

I.District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/ Collector/ Deputy Commissioner/Additional' Deputy Commissioner/ 1st Class Stipendary Magistrate/ Sub Divisional Magistrate/ Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner

II.Chief Presidency Magistrate/Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Presidency Magistrate

III.Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar and

IV.Sub-Divisional Officer or the area where the candidate and/or his family normally resides.

## **Defence sub-category (CW)**

For admission to a seat reserved for Defence sub-category, candidate must produce the following certificates (as applicable), in original, at the time of document verification of Defence candidates.

a. Entitlement card in original issued by the

Record Officer of the Unit/Regiment of Armed Personnel of the Armed Forces in case of Armed Personnel.

b.Widows/ Wards/ Wives of the officers and men of Armed forces who died or were disabled on duty (both attributable to military service) must produce a certificate to that effect from the following authorities:

- (i)Secretary, Kendriya Sainik Board. (ii) Secretary, Rajya / Zila Sainik Board. (iii) Officer-in-Charge, Record Office.
- c.Medical records in original.
- d. Special Pension Order and Passbook indicating special pension.
- e.Gallantry Award Certificate.
- f.Original ex-servicemen Identity Card/ Discharge Book/ Pension Payment Order.
- q.Dependency card issued by the competent authority in order to relate the relationship of the candidate with the Defence personnel.
- h.Original Service Identity Card.
- i.A certificate from the respective C.O. Unit in respect of serving personnel.

NOTE: A statement to the effect that 'the death/disability is attributed to military service' is required to be included in the certificate for Priority III & IV.

THE FINAL PRIORITY WILL BE SUBJECT TO THE SCRUTINY BY PANEL OF DEFENCE EXPERTS AT THE TIME OF DOCUMENT VERIFICATION.
