## General Instructions

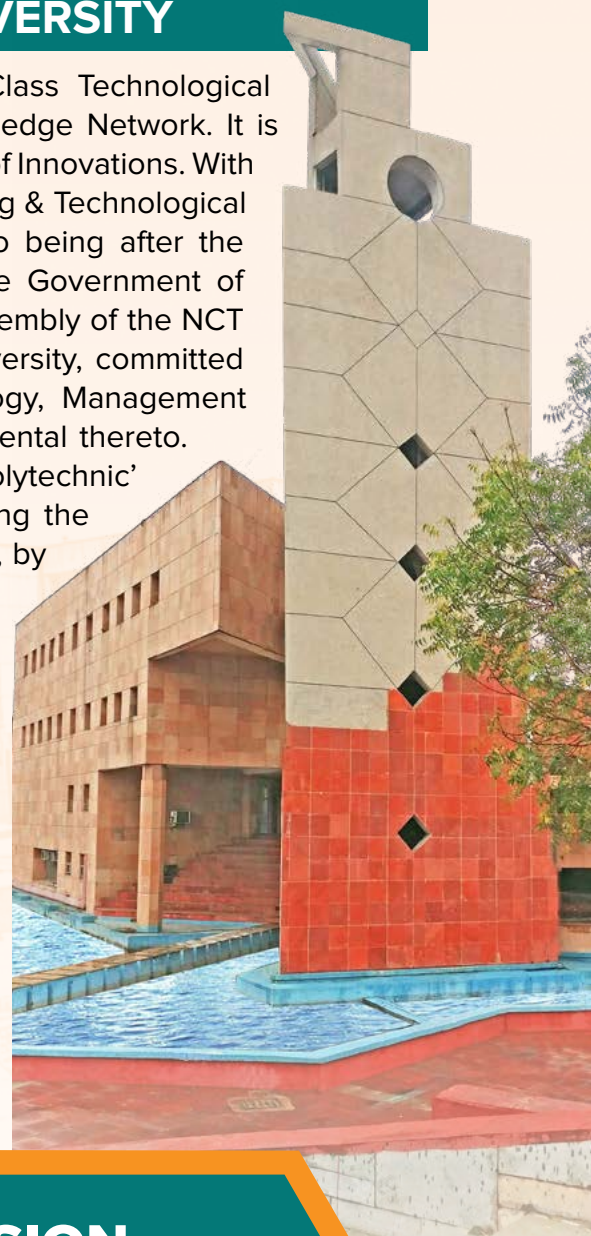
1. The candidates are advised to go through the Admission Brochure carefully and acquaint themselves with all the requirements with respect to filling up of the Online Application Form.
2. The registration fee of Rs. 1500/- is to be paid online through credit/debit card/net banking at the time of registration. After completing the application form successfully if candidate does not pay the registration fee, he/she will not be considered for any seat allotment in any round of the counselling. The fee paid for application for admission shall not be refundable.
3. It is the responsibility of the candidate to ascertain whether he/she possesses the requisite eligibility and qualifications for admission as specified in this brochure.
4. If a candidate is found ineligible at any stage during the admission process or during any stage of the programme, his/her candidature/ admission will be cancelled without any notice and suitable action shall be initiated against him/her including forfeiture of the fee.
5. The applicants are advised to preserve the Online Application Form as well as Acknowledgements if any for future reference.
6. While filling up the application form, the candidate must verify the correctness of all the particulars furnished by him/her. In case any candidate is found to have furnished false information or is found to have concealed any information in his / her application, he / she will be debarred from admission. Further, university reserves the rights to take suitable actions against the applicant in this regard, including forfeiture of the fee.
7. After application form is complete in all respect and all the required documents have been uploaded, candidate must confirm all the details before final submission. The candidate will not be permitted to edit/change details filled in the registration form once the candidate submits the form.
8. Candidates must ensure that Mobile Number and Email Address provided by them must be valid and should belong to the candidate. These will be used by the university for future communications with the candidate. University would not be responsible for communication not being made due to non-existent/faulty communication details provided by the candidate.
9. It is in the interest of candidate to remember his/her Password and keep it highly confidential, to avoid misuse by others.
10. The list of documents required for admission counselling is mentioned in this brochure. Candidates are advised to bring/upload, wherever specified, all the relevant documents as detailed in this brochure and on the CMAC website at the time of admission.
11. The candidate seeking admission under reserved categories has to mandatorily produce the caste/category certificate in his/her name at the time of counselling. The certificate in the name of either of the parents (mother/father) or any other family member is not acceptable and the candidate will not be entitled even for provisional admission. The caste certificate must be uploaded in online admission portal as well. The NCL/ EWS certificates should be issued after 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2026.
12. It is the sole responsibility of the candidate to prove his / her eligibility for claiming reservation under any of the reserved categories. A candidate who is offered a seat under reserved category / sub-category in any round of seat allotment and fails to produce appropriate document in support, his/ her allotted seat will be cancelled and he / she shall be considered for allotment in GENERAL (GN) category in subsequent rounds on submission of a written request by the candidate to university in this regard, subject to eligibility, availability of vacant seats and his/ her merit. University reserves the right to accept or reject such requests.

DTU came into being after the reconstitution of the Delhi College of Engineering by the Government of NCT of Delhi in 2009, by Act 6 of 2009, passed by the assembly of the NCT of Delhi. It is a non-affiliating, teaching and research University, committed to achieve excellence in Engineering, Science, Technology, Management and allied areas and matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

The university, in its various avatars, namely, the ‘Delhi Polytechnic’ and ‘Delhi College of Engineering’ (DCE), has been serving the nation and the global community since its inception in 1941, by providing trained manpower of highest quality in the field of engineering and technology, and, is globally well known for its outstanding education, research and innovations.

The University currently offers various inter-disciplinary and industry relevant programs in Science, Technology, Management, and allied areas at the Undergraduate, Postgraduate and Doctoral level. The University has established a strong academia-industry interface and has collaborations with reputed research organizations, industries, and premier institutions. A great many alumni of the institute have excelled at home and abroad and through their contributions to the profession of engineering they have brought high honour and enhanced the dignity of engineering fraternity being rolled out from institutions in India. The University lays great emphasis on assisting students in the development of national character, self-confidence, leadership and fostering an ecosystem for creativity and imagination.

## Location

Delhi Technological University is situated at Shahbad Daulatpur, Rohini in North - West Delhi, India. It is approximately 32 kilometers from the Indira Gandhi International Airport, New Delhi and the nearest Metro stations are Samaypur Badli/Rithala. Once at Samaypur Badli/Rithala, board local transport, auto or bus to get down at DTU, which is 3-4 kms far from Samaypur Badli/ Rithala Metro Station.

## Programmes Offered

The University offers 14 Undergraduate engineering programmes (B.Tech.) and three bachelor programmes [i.e. B.Des., BBA, BA (Hons.), Economics], 25 M.Tech. programmes, 5 MBA programmes, 4 M.Sc. programmes, MA (Economics) and M.Des. Programme. The university offers Ph.D. programmes in all areas of engineering, science, management and economics. The UG and PG programmes of DTU offer most modern curricula, based on the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), having rich mix of courses from science, engineering, management, social sciences, humanities, fine arts, liberal arts, classical music, sports, etc. The course curricula have been developed with a view to integrate advancements in science and engineering, while also incorporating industry relevant technologies. To provide further flexibility there is provision for credit transfer and earning credits through massive online courses (MOOCs) from different platforms such as NPTEL, SWAYAM, Coursera and Edx etc. The curriculum is regularly updated keeping in view the new technologies and changes in needs of industries and society.

## Faculty and Research

The university has a very talented pool of experienced, as well as young faculty members who are well qualified in their area of specialization and have very good national and international exposure. To engage the students and faculty in research and innovation the university offers provisions

like funding for students' innovative projects, financial assistance to students for attending internship overseas, research project grants to all faculty members etc.

To celebrate the individual's excellence in research, the university gives Research Excellence Awards to researchers in three categories of awards annually, namely, Outstanding Research Awards, Premier Research Awards, and Commendable Research Awards. The awards are open to all the researchers of DTU. The University provides funds to faculty and students to organize and attend various faculty development programs, seminars, and conferences.

## Ranking and Rewards

The university is having ISO 9001:2015 certification since 27.11.2018, accredited with 'A+' grade by NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council) and has been accorded 2(f) and 12-B status by the University Grants Commission (UGC). Many of its UG & PG engineering programmes are also accredited by the National Board of Accreditation (NBA). The University is consistently ranked among best 10 engineering institutions as per the various independent surveys on best engineering institutions of the country. The university has been ranked 9<sup>th</sup> by India Today's Top engineering colleges in India 2024.

The 2024 NIRF rankings placed DTU at the 27<sup>th</sup> position among the engineering institutions and at 48<sup>th</sup> in the categories of universities. DTU has been placed at 801-1000 bracket in the Times Higher Education World University Ranking 2025.

## Campus and Infrastructure

DTU has 164 acres of a lush green, tech-savvy main campus, consisting of 16 academic departments, research centers, and residences for students, faculty, and staff. At present the university has around 15,000 students in its undergraduate,

postgraduate, and Ph. D programs. DTU has an EDUSAT Studio utilized for recording of lectures, events, and talks. Besides the main campus, the university has another campus in East Delhi, where some of the M. B. A programmes, B. A (Hons.) Economics and B.B.A. programmes are offered. The newly established East Delhi Campus of DTU has been functional since the 2017-18 academic session. It is located at Vivek Vihar, Phase II, Delhi. This campus endeavours to provide quality education, research, and innovation in the emerging areas of management, relevant to industry and society.

### Computer Centre

DTU has a well-equipped centralized computer centre to cater to the needs of students and faculty in the university. It is housed, in a magnificent state-of-the-art building having specialized laboratories to provide variety of platforms and computing environment for UG, PG and research students. The centre possesses a number of servers and over 275 Dell intel core i5 computer systems. In addition, the centre has more than 15 servers hosting different applications such as websites & portals, SPSS, Mathematica, MatLab, DNS, LDAP, proxy, Email services, Network Monitoring System (NMS) etc. and 4 SUN CAD workstations meant for use by UG/PG/PhD students for their projects and research work. The center is networked through high-end intelligent Juniper/Avaya/CISCO/ Brocade/Ruckus manageable switches and possesses round the clock two leased lines of 10 Gbps link of NKN and 1Gbps link of Reliance Jio with shared bandwidth in different pipes for the Wi-Fi connectivity in the Library, Academic Departments, Administrative Blocks, Sports Complex, Faculty Residence and Hostel blocks of the campus, with internet facilities on all the nodes. It also has the latest versions of compilers, scientific, technical and engineering software, training kits etc. for the students of different branches of engineering.

### Central Library

DTU library, with a collection of more than 2,00,000 text and reference books and a large number of e-journals, e-books, manuscripts in digital format, is one of the highly rich engineering libraries in the country. Library provides remote access facility to all its readers by using cloud based remote access software. The library also helps researchers to maintain proper integrity and ethics and provides the facility of similarity check to avoid instances of plagiarism. It has a very active presence on Facebook. Various current awareness services and user information literacy programs are continually organized throughout the year. The library building is a four storied, aesthetically designed, centrally air-conditioned structure with a seating capacity of 400. Library is updated regularly by way of adding new literature in the form of text books, reference books, reports, proceedings, abstracts & indexes, encyclopaedias, data books, standards (National & International), Journals & database on CD-ROM.

### Hostel

Hostel life is one of the most enjoyable and memorable time of one's life. There are 11 boys' hostels and 3 girl's hostels in DTU, besides, one separate hostel for international students (boys). Each hostel in the campus gives each individual ample opportunity to develop various qualities as each hostel is equipped with recreation room, reading room, mess and gymnasium. Additionally, every hostel subscribes to the latest magazines and newspapers for the residents. The hostels are connected to the campus via the campus wide wi-fi network and LAN which enables the residents to browse the internet and access the online library resources for their academic and research related work. The information of all available accommodation will be posted on the University website. However, limited

seats could be provided inside the University premises. In addition, the mess facility at the University can be availed by all the students.

### Centre for Extension & Field Outreach

Centre for Extension and Field Outreach was established in DTU in the year 2018. The various activities/ program performed by the Centre is to sensitize the students to develop social values, widespread their responsibilities and knowledge in societal issues and problems by making them to involve with the community people. DTU is a Participating Institute under “Unnat Bharat Abhyan”- a Project of Ministry of HRD, Govt. of India and adopted five villages and are conducting classes in their schools. Directorate of Education, Govt. of NCT of Delhi awarded a Project “Youth for Education” and has launched “Desh Ke Mentor”, which is one of the largest mentoring program in school education. Centre has also started a certificate course titled as “Basic Computer Course”

Under Lab on Wheels (LOW) Scheme for the candidates from the Government Schools of NCT of Delhi or from society. Centre at DTU is coordinating with Delhi Police conducting Skill development program through one-month basic computer training to Juveniles in conflict with law/ weaker section in Rohini. Centre is regularly organizing Seminars/ online webinars/ workshops/ Awareness programs etc and is working towards increasing productivity, enhancing skills and abilities, focusing on growth and helping people to work on their own future development. Additionally, NSS at DTU facilitates enhanced student engagement with community contributing to deeper reservoirs of ideas.

### Innovation and Incubation Foundation (DTU-IIF)

DTU-IIF is a Technology Business Incubator (TBI) established in 2016 as a non-profit section 8 company. Currently, this TBI is

supported by the Government of Delhi and Delhi Technological University. DTU-IIF helps start-up companies and individual entrepreneurs to develop their business ideas by providing a range of services including co-working office space, mentoring support, funding support with venture capital financing, and other supports & resources they need, all under one roof. During last five years, IIF provided 70 lakhs of funds to 56 start-up companies. Also, DTU-IIF promotes the culture of innovation and Entrepreneurship by organizing various webinars/workshops/Hackathons, etc. The Business Review Committee screens the new ideas and recommends incubation at DTU-IIF. The Finance Review Committee recommends the investment of Rs. 7.5 lakh per start-up. Delhi Technological University established Technology Business Incubator (TBI) in the name of DTU Innovation and Incubation Foundation (DTU-IIF). DTU-IIF was incorporated as section 8 Company on 06.09.2016.

### Sports and Other Outdoor Activities

The students of DTU are provided with excellent facilities for indoor and outdoor games. DTU has 4 x 400m racing track, fields for football, hockey, cricket, courts for volleyball, basketball, tennis, badminton, along with facilities for indoor games. A well-equipped gymnasium is also available in the campus in addition to gym facilities in each hostel. The university has appointed coaches in almost all the games to train the students and prepare university teams. Students are encouraged to participate in various sporting events and tournaments held in, and around, NCR of Delhi. From academic year 2018-19, as per the revised curriculum, the university offers foundation electives to the students of first year and second year and in these sports have big share of electives. A large number of bright and capable scholars, having graduated from the Institute, have distinguished

themselves by means of their extraordinary achievements in their chosen professions and by their contributions to the society at large.

### DCE-DTU Alumni Network

DCE-DTU Alumni are serving leadership positions in many of the best-known companies in India and abroad, in marketing, finance, human resources, information technology, research & analytics, innovation & entrepreneurship. And the worldwide network of illustrious alumni includes world-known personalities like Prof. Vinod Dham (Father of the Pentium Chip), Dr. Raj Soin (Founder, CEO of Soin, and LLC), Prof. D. Yogi. Goswami (Inventor, Author, Entrepreneur and Educator), Dr. Durga Das Aggarwal (President, CEO Piping Technology & Products, Inc). Mr. Vijay Shekhar Sharma, (Founder of Paytm), Sh. Karnal Singh (Former Chief of Enforcement Directorate), Sh. Arun Goyal (Member-CERC & Former Secretary, Cabinet Secretariat).

Alumni have been traditionally contributing generously towards placement opportunities, sponsorships/ Fellowship programs and infrastructural developments of their alma mater. Donations for Raj Soin Hall by Dr. Soin, Clean Energy Research Centre establishment by Prof. Yogi Goswami, and several scholarships for the students of DTU have shown the dedication of the alumni for the betterment of their alma mater. Vinod Dham has sponsored “Centre of Excellence for Semi-conductors and Micro-electronics” to established centralized state of art infrastructure facility for device design / material research / fabrication for cutting edge R&D in Semi- conductors and Micro-electronics.

### Events and Festivals

The university organizes annual cultural, literary, sports and technical festivals. These festivals not just provide an opportunity to the students to connect with the professional world, but also display their creative and technical skills in several interesting events and activities organized during the fests. The ENGIFEST, one of the most well attended student’s cultural event in northern India and the YUVAAN, the literary Fest, is annual cultural extravaganza of the university and offers a good mix of literary, cultural, and entertainment events. The “INVICTUS” is annual technical festival of the university where all technical societies of the university host various technical activities and competition. The AAHVAAAN is the annual sports fest organized by DTU sports council.

### Medical Facilities

DTU has a well-equipped health care centre. The medical practitioners are available to the students requiring medical attention. The healthcare centre has specialized medical practitioners including ENT, dental care, Physiotherapy, Nutrition, Gynaecology and Obstetrics etc. Further, medical camps are also being organized by the University on regular basis. In addition, Ambulance facility is also available in case of emergency. The University has also tie- ups with the major hospitals of Delhi for emergency cases.

## ABOUT UNIVERSITY SCHOOL OF MANAGEMENT & ENTREPRENEURSHIP (USME)

The USME was established in the East Delhi campus (EDC) of DTU in the year 2017, to fulfill its mission of offering a portfolio of the highest quality of programs aimed at emerging areas such as analytics and venture development, and the creation of an ecosystem for learning, research and practice in management and entrepreneurship. It aims to grow into a nodal centre for entrepreneurship, and to become a multidisciplinary practice-oriented school.

Situated in the East of Delhi, the Campus comprises three disciplines of Management, Economics and Innovation, Entrepreneurship, and Venture Development, with faculty having a background of leading institutions such as IIM Calcutta/Lucknow, IIFT, IIT Madras, JNU, DSE, etc. It houses an ecosystem that is not only multidisciplinary, but multidimensional in its range of activities.

USME not only offers degree programs at the UG, PG and doctoral levels, it has also conducted intense workshops for students such as in Entrepreneurship, Business Strategy, R for Machine Learning, the Startup Conclave etc. which provide a lot of co-curricular learning. The cultural council and a range of student societies promote

a rich co-curricular and extra-curricular life on Campus. These activities have drawn students from across India, including from the IIMs and other premier colleges, and students also participate in many national level festivals and competitions.

The first USME Internship fair organised in February 2020 resulted in over three hundred fifty internship offers. This has been continued over the past many years with its 6<sup>th</sup> edition conducted in 2026, which too was a resounding success. Regular guest lectures and workshops strengthen the skillsets of the students throughout the academic year.

USME has added very modern classroom infrastructure and discussion spaces, a state-of-art library and information centre, seminar rooms, and a 200-capacity state of the art Manthan Hall. The Campus students organize various events ranging from cultural fests, talks, business contests, and internship/final placement fairs, workshops and a lecture series of thought leaders across disciplines. Common Rooms, Sports and Recreation.



There is a separate common room for girl students, and it has many facilities along with carrom and TT tables, found in all common rooms. Badminton, volleyball and basketball courts are also there in East Delhi Campus, along with access to all the famed DTU Main Campus sports complex facilities for lawn tennis, cricket, gymnastics, basketball, etc. It also sends its own teams to competitions in various sports. USME offers the Master of Arts (MA) in Economics and Executive MBA (Data Science and Analytics) programmes at the PG level and the Bachelor of Business Administration

(BBA), BBAIEV and Bachelor of Arts (Honours) in Economics programmes at the UG level. The Ph.D. programs in Management, Economics and Entrepreneurship/Venture Development disciplines invites many scholars each year. There are over one thousand students on the USME Campus at present.

## About the BBA Program

The four-year undergraduate program is proposed on the philosophy and structural elements proposed in the New Education Policy 2020, and the Curriculum and Credit Framework for undergraduate programs published by the UGC in December 2022. It has also kept in mind the structural and curricular elements which had been incorporated by USME, DTU in 2020, meant to enhance the learning of students in the Undergraduate Program in Economics by broadening the curriculum to include aligned complementary disciplines such as analytics and programming, as well as management, where students would aim to build their careers. The elements of learning in areas which inculcate better life skills and perspectives, which were present in the earlier design, such as ability and skill enhancement and value based education, have also been strengthened.

The major elements of NEP 2020 such as a structure of certification providing flexibility of learning curriculum, multidisciplinary learning, interdisciplinary courses, providing for deeper learning in dual disciplines such as through a Minor, have been brought into the curriculum. Fostering an integration of the humanities/social sciences with Science, technology and mathematical subject domains (STEM), to draw from the UGC Curricular Framework, would result in “positive learning outcomes, including increased creativity and innovation, critical thinking and higher-order thinking capacities,

problem-solving abilities, teamwork, communication skills, more in-depth learning and mastery of curricula across fields”. The current framework incorporates this idea to ensure a diversity of curricular components drawn from many of these fields, to nurture the above outcomes, through appropriate multidisciplinary, ability, skill and value add based courses.

The option of multiple entry/exit has also made part of the curricular structure, following the guidelines of the NEP and the UGC framework. The unique focus on being a practice-based school, with curricula based on holistic knowledge, skills and application orientation, with a focus on cutting edge areas of practice, has brought in the specific combination of disciplinary elements around economics and data sciences for providing minor around opportunity areas for careers normally associated with management graduates, including a focus on research and quantitative techniques. It is also imbued with a strong focus on the major, the core discipline of management, ensuring that students would be able to build careers in finance, marketing or human resource management and related fields at an advanced level. It is envisaged that with management, the streams of economics and decision sciences/analytics that have proven to be of great value, will be strengthened with the provision of a minor in either area.

## Admissions to BBA program at DTU

Admissions to BBA Program at DTU are conducted through Combined Management Admissions Committee (CMAC) of three Universities, viz Delhi Technological University, Netaji Subhash University of Technology and Indira Gandhi Delhi Technological University for Women.

### Eligibility Criteria

- i. The candidate must have scored at least 50% marks in the 12<sup>th</sup> board examination from a recognised board and must have passed English as a subject in the 12<sup>th</sup> Board Examination.
- ii. Candidates belonging to the OBC and Defence Personnel categories shall be eligible for a relaxation of 5% in the minimum marks criterion.
- iii. Candidates belonging to the SC, ST and PwD categories shall be eligible for a relaxation of 10% marks in the minimum marks criterion.
- iv. The candidate must have appeared for Common University Entrance Test (CUET) - UG 2026 conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA) in English Code 101 and General Aptitude Test (Code 501) of CUET 2026.

### Selection Criterion:

- a. The admissions in BBA program will be based on score of CUET -UG 2026. Seat allotment will be done strictly on the basis of the merit of the candidate, priority/choice of the institution/university filled by the candidate and availability of seats in the respective category of the candidate as per rules. For more details please refer admission brochure of the respective universities.
- b. The merit list will be prepared on the basis of score of CUET UG 2026 in the following two components:
- c. English (Code 101) and General Aptitude Test (Code 501)

The weightage of the above components in preparation of the Merit list will be as follows:

- d. In case of tie in the final merit list, the following criteria shall be used:
  - i. The candidate with higher score in General Aptitude Test shall be ranked higher.
  - ii. In case of tie in score in General Aptitude Test, the candidate older in age will be ranked higher.
  - iii. In case of tie in the age criterion, the candidate with higher score in English (Class XII) shall be ranked higher.
  - iv. In case of tie in English (Class XII), random number will be used to break the tie.

**Note:** - If the Candidate has not appeared in the tests of English (Code 101) and General Test (Code 501) in CUET UG 2026, such candidate will not be considered in the merit List and such candidates need not to apply for BBA admissions through CMAC 2026.

**Note: The University may invite fresh applications against vacant seats, if any, by following an alternative admission criterion as decided by the University.**

## Counselling & Payment of Seat Acceptance Fee

Seat allotment will be done strictly on the basis of the merit of the candidate, priority/choice of the institution/university filled by the candidate and availability of seats in the respective category of the candidate as per rules. The allotment of seats, Documents Verification Schedule and Part admission fee payment schedule (Rs. 1,00,000) will be notified on CMAC website. If the candidate does not appear for documents verification, his/her seat will automatically get cancelled. A candidate, who is allotted a seat in any round of counselling is required to pay the part admission fee of Rs. 1,00,000/- (Rs. One Lakh only) as per the payment mode instructed in the guidelines of counseling (The detailed guidelines will be issued in due course of time on CMAC-2026 website).

Balance fees need to be paid by the candidate at Delhi Technological University at the time of academic registration. All the candidates who get an allotment will have to pay part admission fee (Rs.1,00,000/- Rupees One Lakh) as per the admission schedule, failing which his/her allotted seat will stand automatically cancelled and the candidate will not be considered for subsequent rounds of seat allotment. However, such candidates are eligible for spot round of counselling.

All provisionally admitted candidates are required to visit the website [www.dtu.ac.in](http://www.dtu.ac.in) for physical verification of original documents/commencement of classes and payment of balance fee (if any). Admitted candidates need to pay the balance fee of Delhi Technological University as per fee payment schedule which will be announced on DTU website in due course, failing which, the admission of the candidate automatically stands cancelled ipso facto.

### Upgradation

After each round of counselling, the admitted candidates will be upgraded to the University as per the rank of the candidate, choice/priority of the candidate filled in application form and availability of seats in the respective category of the candidate as per rules. Candidates are advised to fill the choices carefully.

### Spot Round

Spot round may be conducted if seats remain vacant. Details of spot round will be notified on the website [www.cmacadmissions.com](http://www.cmacadmissions.com).

## Reservation Policy

### Region

Delhi Region Candidates (85% of seats) - A candidate passing the qualifying examination from a recognized School / College / Institute located within the National Capital Territory (NCT) of Delhi will be considered for Delhi Region only.

Outside Delhi Region Candidates (15% of seats) - A candidate passing the qualifying examination from a recognized School / College / Institute located outside the National Capital Territory (NCT) of Delhi will be considered for Outside Delhi Region only.

**NOTE:** For a candidate, who has passed the qualifying examination through Patrachar Vidyalaya, Delhi / National Institute of Open School, Delhi (NIOS), the criterion for deciding the region shall be the location of his/her centre of examination. In other words, if the centre of examination is located in the N.C.T. of Delhi, the candidate shall be considered under the Delhi Region and if

the centre of examination is located outside N.C.T. of Delhi, he/she shall be considered under the Outside Delhi Region.

### Category & Subcategory

- Scheduled Caste (SC):** 15% of the total seats are reserved for Scheduled Caste candidates.
- Scheduled Tribe (ST):** 7.5% of the total seats are reserved for Scheduled Tribe candidates.
- Other Backward Class (OBC- NCL):** 27% of the total seats are reserved for Other Backward Class (Non-Creamy Layer) candidates.

**Priority III** - Widows/wards of defence personnel who died in peace time with death attributable to military service.

**Priority IV** - Wards of defence personnel disabled in service and boarded out from service with disability attributed to military service.

**Priority V** - Wards of serving defence personnel and ex-servicemen who are in receipt of the following Gallantry Awards: 1. Param Vir Chakra 2. Ashok Chakra 3. Mahavir Chakra 4. Kirti Chakra 5. Vir Chakra 6. Shaurya Chakra 7. Sena/ NauSena/ Vayu Sena Medal 8. Mention-in-Despatches

**Priority VI** - Wards of Ex-servicemen.

**Priority VII** - Wives of

- i. Defence personnel disabled in action and boarded out from service
- ii. Defence personnel disabled in service and boarded with disability attributable to military service
- iii. Ex-servicemen and serving personnel who are in receipt of Gallantry awards.

**Priority VIII** - Wards of serving personnel.

**Priority IX** - Wives of serving personnel.

**f. Person with Disability (PD):** 5% of the total seats in each category are reserved for candidates belonging to 'Person with Disability' sub-category

**g. Kashmiri Migrants (KM) Supernumerary:** One seat over and above the total intake in each course, is available under this category. First preference will be given to Kashmiri Migrant candidate:

- i. who has passed the qualifying examination from a school/college/

institute located within the NCT of Delhi;

- ii. whose parents are registered in Delhi up to 11.06.2001 as Kashmiri Migrant;
- iii. and who is residing in the N.C.T. of Delhi.

**NOTE:** In case of seat remaining vacant, Kashmiri Migrant settled outside Delhi will be considered.

**h. Single Girl (SG) Child Supernumerary:**

One seat in each course over and above the normal intake is reserved for single girl child candidate (girl having no brother and sister alive) who has passed 10+2 from schools located in NCT of Delhi.

**Note:**

- i. In case of category (a) and (b), the vacant seats are interchangeable.
- ii. In case, sufficient numbers of eligible candidates from category (c) are not available, the vacancies will be treated as unreserved.
- iii. In case, sufficient number of eligible candidates from the subcategories mentioned at (e) and (f) are not available, the vacancies will be treated as unreserved in the respective category.
- iv. Under CW sub-category, the seats will be filled based on the priority i.e. all eligible candidates of priority-I will be allotted seats based on their ranks until the ranks exhaustor seats exhaust under CW subcategory. Remaining vacant seats, if any, will be allotted to the priority-II in the similar way, and so on. The reservation under CW subcategory is available only to such candidates who fall under the listed priorities.
- v. It is the sole responsibility of the candidate to prove his/her eligibility for claiming reservation under any of the reserved categories / subcategories. The candidates claiming reservation under SC / ST / OBC/ KM / SG / EWS categories, CW / PD sub-categories will be required to produce the original

certificate of the respective reserved category/ sub-category issued by the competent authority (as mentioned in this information brochure) at the time of document verification. If the reserved category / sub-category certificate is not found to be in order, no benefit of the reserved category/sub-category will be

given and provisionally allotted seat to that candidate will stand automatically cancelled. Such candidates may be considered under General category/ sub-category in respective state quota for subsequent rounds of counselling on submission of a request in this regard.

## WITHDRAWAL POLICY

## CERTIFICATES REQUIRED FOR RESERVED SEATS AT THE TIME OF DOCUMENT VERIFICATION

Candidates applying for any reserved seat (i.e. SC, ST, OBC-NCL, EWS, CW, PD, KM) must produce the original certificates (as applicable) as mentioned below at the time of document verification.

i) **Scheduled Caste (SC)/Scheduled Tribe (ST) /Other Backward Class (OBCNCL)/ Economically Weaker Section (EWS):**

For admission to a seat reserved for Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/Other Backward Class (NCL)/ Economically Weaker Section (EWS), candidate must produce a certificate, in original, issued from an approved district authority stating the Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe/ Other Backward Class (NCL)/ Economically Weaker Section (EWS), to which the candidate belongs. A list of approved authorities is given below:

- a. District Magistrate / Additional Magistrate / Deputy Commissioner / Collector / Additional Deputy Commissioner / Deputy Collector / 1<sup>st</sup> Class Stipendiary Magistrate / City Magistrate (not below the rank of 1<sup>st</sup> Class Stipendiary Magistrate), Sub-Divisional Magistrate / Taluka Magistrate / Executive Magistrate / Extra Assistant Commissioner.
- b. Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- c. Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidates and/or his/her family normally resides
- d. Administrator/Secretary to Administration/Development Officer (Laccadive & Minicoy Islands).

ii) **Person with Disability sub-category:** For admission to seat reserved for Differently Abled Person (PD) sub-category, the candidate must produce the following certificates in original at the time of document verification for PD candidates:

a. A certificate of physical disability issued by a duly notified Medical Board of a District/Government Hospital set up for examining the physically challenged candidates under the provision of the Person with Disability (equal opportunities, protection of rights and full participation) Act 1995. The certificate should indicate the extent (i.e. percentage) of the physical handicap and should bear the Photograph of the candidate concerned. The certificate should be countersigned by one of the Doctors constituting the Board issuing the certificates.

b. A certificate duly recommended by Vocational Rehabilitation Centre for the Handicapped, 9-11 Vikas Marg, Karkardooma, Delhi 110092.

iii) **Defence subcategory-** For admission to a seat reserved for Defence subcategory, candidate must produce the following certificates (as applicable), in original, at the time of document verification:

a. Entitlement card in original issued by the Record Officer of the Unit/ Regiment of Armed Personnel of the Armed Forces in case of Armed Personnel or from the Home Ministry in case of Para-Military forces.

b. Widows/ Wards of the officers and men of Armed forces including Para-Military personnel who died or disabled on duty (both attributable to military service) must produce a certificate to that effect from the following authorities.

- i. Secretary, Kendriya Sainik Board.
- ii. Secretary, Rajya/Zila Sainik Board.
- iii. Officer-in-Charge, Record Office.

In case of Para-Military forces appropriate documents/certificates

issued by Competent Authority notified in this regard by the Para-Military forces headquarters must be produced. A statement to the effect that “the death/physical disability (percentage to be mentioned) is attributed to military service” is required to be included in the certificate.

- c. Medical records in original.
- d. Special Pension Order and Passbook indicating special pension.
- e. Gallantry award certificate.
- f. Original ex-servicemen Identity Card/ Discharge Book/ Pension Payment Order.
- g. Dependency card issued by the competent authority in order to relate the relationship of the candidate with the Defence personnel/gallantry award recipient.
- h. Original Service Identity Card
- i. A certificate from the respective C.O. Unit in respect of serving personnel (Priority VII).

**NOTE:** A statement to the effect that ‘the death/disability is attributed to military service’ is required to be included in the certificate for Priority III & IV.

iv) **Kashmiri Migrants:** The candidates seeking admission under Kashmiri Migrants seats must produce the following documents, in original, at the time of document verification:

- a. Marksheet of qualifying examination
- b. Certificate of registration as Kashmiri Migrants issued by the Relief Commissioner, Jammu or Divisional Commissioner, Delhi to establish the status of the applicant as registered migrants.
- c. Proof of property in Kashmir of the parent of the candidate.
- d. Proof of current residence such as Ration Card, Photo Identity Card

issued by the Election Commissioner, Driving License, etc.

- v) **Single Girl Child** - For claiming admission under the Single Girl Child category, the Father/Mother/Guardian (in case parents are deceased) shall have to submit affidavit / self-attested to this effect duly attested by area District Magistrate /Additional Magistrate / Deputy Commissioner / Collector / Additional Deputy Commissioner / Deputy Collector / 1<sup>st</sup> Class Stipendiary Magistrate / City Magistrate (not below the rank of 1<sup>st</sup> Class Stipendiary Magistrate), Sub-Divisional Magistrate / Taluka Magistrate / Executive Magistrate / Extra Assistant Commissioner

**NOTE:**

1. The candidate seeking admission under reserved categories has to mandatorily produce the caste/category certificate in his/her name at the time of counselling. The certificate in the name of either of the parents (mother/father) or any other family member is not acceptable and the candidate will not be entitled even for provisional admission.
2. The reservation certificate should be issued from the respective state/region in which the reservation is being claimed, e.g. in case, a candidate claims the seat reserved for the Delhi Region category, he/she has to bring SC/ST/OBC certificate issued by Govt. of NCT of Delhi and should have also passed his/her qualifying examination from a School / College / Institute located in National Capital Territory of Delhi.
3. OBC (NCL) candidates are required to produce a caste certificate issued after March 31, 2026 from the authorities as mentioned above. However, if the certificate is issued prior to March 31, 2026, it must be accompanied with an additional certificate regarding the present non-creamy layer status of the candidate, issued by the same competent authority. This additional certificate must have reference of his / her already issued original caste certificate.
4. The EWS Certificate should be issued after March 31, 2026.
